### Open Class Primary Livestock

Judging: See associated Department.

**Premiums – \$3**

#### Rules

- A. Entries due June 30 **if you are showing an animal.**
- B. This division is open to all youth ages 5-7 as of January 1 of the current year.
- C. Only one entry per class, per exhibitor will be accepted.
- D. All exhibitors will receive a primary participation ribbon for each class shown in. Classes will not be placed.
- E. All primary exhibitors shall conform to the originating division's applicable rules and the requirements of that department superintendent.
- F. Enrolled primary 4-H members will turn in their record book for judging on Friday prior to start of fair, 5-7 p.m. for judging on Saturday.
- G. Primary livestock **are not** eligible to participate in the livestock parade.

#### Class No.

**1. Primary Calf Showmanship** \* (bucket calf type) – Wednesday, July 26, immediately following the beef show on the track (prior entry mandatory).

\* See 4-H Bucket Calf Project for general and fair requirements for showing, stalling and release.

**2. Primary Lamb Showmanship** – Tuesday, July 25, following the sheep showmanship classes (prior entry mandatory).

**3. Primary Goat Showmanship** – Tuesday, July 25, 3 p.m., immediately following the goat showmanship classes (prior entry mandatory).

**4. Primary Poultry** – Monday, July 24, following 4-H poultry showmanship (prior entry mandatory).

**5. Primary Rabbit** – Monday, July 24, following 4-H rabbit showmanship (prior entry mandatory).

**6. Primary Leadline (Walk/Jog)** – Thursday, July 27, immediately following 4-H Horse Halter Show (prior entry mandatory).

**Leadline Rules** (in addition to Department CC General Rules):

- A. Rider's Attire – Jeans, long sleeve shirt, cowboy boots, and an **ASTM/SEI** approved Riding Helmet are all required. No spurs allowed.
- B. All riders must be escorted by an adult 18 years of age and over. Additional spotters may also be used at guardian's discretion.
- C. Parents/legal guardians and all spotters must wear jeans and hard sole, closed toe shoes appropriate for use around horses.
- D. Horses intended solely for the Primary Leadline class that are not entered in any other 4-H horse show class will NOT be stalled on the fairgrounds unless prior arrangement and approval from horse department superintendent(s) has been made.
- E. Horse superintendent(s) or fair officials will be allowed to excuse any horse deemed unsafe or unruly from the class as well as any exhibitors and parents/guardians/spotters who do not meet required dress code/attire.
