BURLINGTON, Colo. --- The following is a correction to the County Events Day information that was published on June 17, 2020 in the Burlington Record. The Kit Carson County Commissioners, Fair Board, and the Department of Public Health have been closely monitoring the COVID situation to ensure the safety of KCC fair participants and patrons remain a top priority. While plans are in place to have the KCC fair, decisions are still being made as to which events will be able to be included in the County Events Day celebration, and the fair in general. It is the goal of the commissioners, fair board and KCC public health, to make those decisions on July 2nd. More information will be made available to the public at that time.

Honoring our western and agricultural heritage and supporting our young people and their families remains at the center of our mission. That said, the health and safety of our volunteers, youth participants, vendors, contestants, fans, and sponsors is first and foremost. Quick reminder from Phil– If you are going out on FMLA for maternity leave or medical leave, we need to know the last date worked/date leave started for payroll purposes.

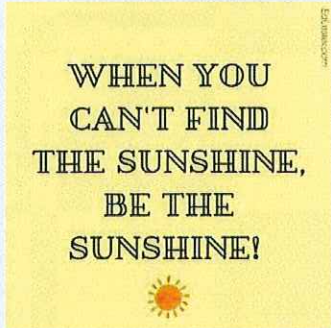

Bills are due Monday's by 4pm, but turning them in early is always a good option. Please turn in coded credit receipts, as they still need to be input into the system, and is a good tracking system.

With our new software, Purchase order processes are a little bit different. When requesting a PO be sure to request it in the name of the vendor, UNLESS you are paying with a credit card, then the PO needs to be made out to the name of the credit card, and the vendor and product need to be in the description. We also need the quote to be coded. When turning the PO in for payment, be sure to write the PO number on the voucher, and/or receipt.
